Tournament Dates: 19th – 21st February 2026

Tournament Host Club: Hamilton Raiders Baseball

Location & Venue: Mahoe Park, Hamilton

Open Men's Roster Size: Minimum 12 players, maximum 20 players. Rosters must have a minimum of 8 registered players from their own club.

Age Eligibility: 35 years or above as at 1st September 2024

50% Team Fees due upon team registration to confirm registration with the full balance due no later than 30th January 2026.

Team Registrations Fee:

The National Masters team entry fees include; your team's tournament entry, match umpires, live scoring, shared team tent, first aid and tournament management and venue costs.

A 50% deposit of team fees is required to secure your team's place in the tournament, with full payment required no later than 30th January 2026.

If full payment is not received by the due date, team registration will be cancelled and not included in the draw. NO Late registrations will be accepted.

Team Tents/Marquees:

Each team competing in the National Master's tournament can bring a team marquee, fold up chairs, tables and BBQ's etc, these can only be set up in the team tents allocation areas on site map.

Medical & Emergency:

Throughout the National Masters tournament, there will be an onsite medic available each day.

We recommend each team carries their own first aid kit and ice/ice-packs to assist their team with managing any pre-existing injuries, blisters or the likes.

For any sickness/illness it is recommended to isolate the player to minimise the spread of illness and seek any medical attention as necessary (see below).

For concussion management, please refer to Baseball NZ's <u>Concussion Policy</u> and the <u>ACC SportSmart</u> website and Sport Concussion National Guidelines. All direct head knocks, blows or potential concussive events MUST seek medical clearance from a medical doctor to return to play.

Tournament eligibility

The National Masters Invitational Championship tournament is a national club-based tournament for Masters grade teams to compete for a national title in each grade. This year, we have also opened this tournament up to allow 1 or more international teams to enter.

1. Eligibility

All 2025/26 season registered players, residing in New Zealand and are **35 years of age or above as at the 1**st of **September 2025** are eligible to compete in the 2026 National Masters Invitational Championship.

If residing overseas, players must be New Zealand citizens or of New Zealand heritage via one or more parents. All other baseball players can be considered via a dispensation. Interested players (families) must be registered with Baseball NZ and in good standing with the national body, their regional association and their club. Interested Players should have a proven close alliance or history with the club they are seeking to represent through any dispensation.

In all National Tournaments, to be considered for a National Tournament roster, a player must have played a minimum of four (4) regular season games for their club recorded in the My Ballclub scoring platform. Anyone who has played less than four (4) club games may be eligible for the tournament through the dispensation process or pick-up player pool.

Players will NOT be penalized within New Zealand if no club or regional body exists in their region or city, such as New Plymouth and Dunedin, for example, both of which do not yet have baseball clubs.

2. Dispensations

Player dispensations for the 2026 National Master's tournament will only be awarded in exceptional and extenuating circumstances. Points to note in the player dispensation process:

- There is a maximum of 4 dispensations per team for the 2026 National Master's tournament.
- A club is allowed to apply for dispensation of one under-age player; however, the club would need to demonstrate they have exhausted all their options of registered age-eligible players, and the dispensated player must be at least 30 years old as at 1st September 2025.
- Where a club is seeking dispensation for a player who has not met the 4-official game minimum requirement, a club would need to clearly outline why this person was unable to meet this minimum game requirement.
- Player dispensations can only be applied for, through this process and dispensation form. No other option is available to grant a dispensation. The Head Coach / Manager or Executive Officer (EO) must submit the player dispensation request with the endorsement of the club and player.

All player dispensations will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis after a thorough review of the club's regular season members and team/s. All dispensations must be received no later than 23rd January 2026, 11.59pm. No Late dispensations will be considered.

Each dispensation request MUST provide valid and clear rationale and detailed information, plus demonstrate why registered, age-eligible, or those that have met the required 4-game minimum players, are not able to undertake this roster position.

3. Pick-Up Players and Teams

Baseball NZ encourages participation at national tournaments in a fair and consistent manner. To support this, pick-up players will continue to be permitted for the 2026 National Masters Invitational Championship, with the process now managed directly by clubs and teams.

Eligibility and Requirements:

- Only players registered for the 2025/26 season are eligible to be pick-up players.
- No underage pick-up players are allowed.
- A club must have a minimum of 8 eligible players to register a team.
- Clubs may pick up players from outside their region only after exhausting all reasonable options within their own region to meet minimum roster requirements.
- Pick-up players must have approval from their registered club or regional association before being added to another team.
- A dispensation request must be submitted and approved by Baseball NZ before any pick-up player is officially added to a team's roster.
- Clubs are encouraged to prioritise ensuring all teams meet the minimum roster requirement (12 players) before adding additional players up to the recommended maximum (20 players).
- The picking-up club/team is solely responsible for the communication, planning, support, health, safety, and wellbeing of all pick-up players for the duration of the tournament.
